FOOD NICHES.

BY OCCUPYING DIFFERENT FOOD NICHES, COMPETITION BETWEEN SPECIES IS MINIMIZED.

FROM ABOVE : SWALLOWS PLY THE AIR FOR INSECTS, A GREY FANTAIL TAKES INSECTS AROUND THE FOLIAGE, PARDALOTES FEED ON INSECTS ON THE FOLIAGE. A ROSELLA FEEDS ON SEED WHILE A TREECREEPER TAKES INSECTS FROM THE BARK, A HONEYEATER FEEDS ON NECTAR FROM THE BLOSSOM, A WREN TAKES FROM THE UNDERSTOREY AND FINCHES TAKE GRASS SEEDS.
